(06:56:15) Ms. Olson conveyed a concern that personnel calculations for phased projects may be overlapping, thus paying multiple times for the same individuals over time.

(06:57:40) Opportunity for Public to Address the Council No public comment was heard.

(06:58:00) Mr. Hartwell proposed a draft framework for a council allocation process. Members discussed the proposal. Greg Knopff, lead analyst for the Senate, stated that as a legislative entity, the council follows Mason's Manual for Legislative Bodies which precludes requiring a member to second or third a motion. In addition, he confirmed that when allocation information was made available to members, it would also need to be made available to the public at that time. Members continued to discuss the council's allocation process at length.

(07:27:00) Motion by Ms. Kingston that the council never recommend for allocation more to a proposal than has been requested. Mr. Hartwell offered an amendment that the council may recommend an allocation of zero dollars, but does not recommend to allocate less than \$400,000, the threshold for the Conservation Partners Legacy Program. Ms. Kingston accepted the amendment.

(07:28:20) Motion by Mr. Hartwell to adopt the following process guidelines:

LSOHC Allocation Process Guidelines

- 1) Members fill out allocation spreadsheet and submit it to staff by September 9th. No allocations under the cutoff for direct funding (\$400,000 under this and it is eligible for CPL funding). Allocations may be zero or above \$400,000, but may not exceed the request amount.
- Staff collects and prepares the information showing both individual and collective funding recommendation. The collective information shows both the amount and the number of members recommending funding.

- 3) Both spreadsheets are distributed to members no later than 3 days before the meeting of the council to determine the initial allocation. The information will simultaneously be made available to the public via the LSOHC website.
- 4) The Chair's Proposal is distributed to members indicating the average allocation to programs with 9 or more members recommending funding as an initial start to discussion. Ms. Olson requested the average member recommendation be presented along with the mode of allocations for each proposal. Mr. Hartwell agreed.
- 5) The council will then discuss the projects "above the line" without any motions to change an allocation up or down based on the discussion. The discussion could be about the need to fully fund, limit funding to a lower level than the average, restrict funding to a specific part of any request, etc.
- 6) Once that discussion is concluded, the council will open discussion on other projects. Again, those discussions would be to better understand the different perspectives by council members.
- 7) Allocations will then proceed as determined by the council at that time.

(07:29:45) Ms. Kingston withdraws her motion. Mr. Tilley suggested the process document be considered to be non-binding guidelines. Mr. Hartwell agreed.

(07:34:20) Mr. Hartwell's motion is adopted.
