Background:

Minnesota Statute 97A.056, subd. 15(b), directs that "A recipient of funding that acquires an interest in real property subject to this subdivision may not alter the intended use of the interest in real property or convey any interest in the real property acquired with the appropriation without the prior review and approval of the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council or its successor. The council shall notify the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees and divisions with jurisdiction over the outdoor heritage fund at least 15 business days before approval under this paragraph..."

Under ML 2011, First Special Session, Ch. 6, Art. 1, Sec. 2, Subd. 4 (c), for Shallow Lake Shoreland Protection: Wild Rice Lakes Pilot, Ducks Unlimited purchased a 28 acre parcel on Moose Lake in St. Louis County. Ducks Unlimited is seeking Council permission to convey the fee title and future management obligations for the property to the USDA Forest Service for inclusion as part of the Superior National Forest. With completion of this transfer, the entire lakeshore of Moose Lake will be owned, protected and uniformly managed by USDA Forest Service.

As evidenced by the attached letter by USDA Forest Supervisor Brenda Halter, the USDA Forest Service is agreeable to acceptance and management of the parcel in congruence with LSOHC approval and restrictions as stated ML 2011, First Special Session, Ch. 6, Art. 1, Sec. 2, Subd. 4 (c).

Per 97A.056, subd. 15(b), LSOHC staff has informed the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees and divisions with jurisdiction over the OHF.

Move to approve the transfer of the 28 acre parcel on Moose Lake in St. Louis County to the USDA Forest Service.

Dear Mark Johnson, Executive Director, Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council:

Please accept this email as my formal request to the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council for permission to transfer, via land donation, the 28-acre "Marlow Tract" we purchased on Moose Lake in St. Louis County to the USDA's Forest Service for inclusion in the Superior National Forest. Attached is a letter we received last week from the Forest Service agreeing to accept the state OHF appropriation statutory requirements associated with the donation and ownership of this land.

Ducks Unlimited purchased this tract on June 30, 2014 through a 2011 Outdoor Heritage Fund appropriation to the Minnesota Board of Water & Soil Resources, Ducks Unlimited, and Minnesota DNR for "Shallow Lake Shoreland Protection: Wild Rice Lakes Pilot" [ML 2011, Ch. 6, Art. 1, Sec. 2, Subd. 4 (c)]. Ducks Unlimited appraised and purchased this land following the approval of an amendment request to our grant accomplishment plan approved in early April 2014 by then Executive Director Bill Becker and receipt of an initial letter from Superior Forest Supervisor advising us of their desire to own and manage this land to protect Moose Lake (see attached). Also attached is a map and aerial photo of the parcel along Moose Lake for your reference. Please note that this was the last private parcel of land on Moose Lake, and it was for sale for development, so the entire shoreline of Moose Lake is now permanently protected as a result of this small land acquisition project. Please note this is also the first facilitative land acquisition project for the USDA Forest Service funded through a state Outdoor Heritage Fund appropriation. The parcel is approximately 12 acres of upland forest along the lake and 16 acres of scrub-shrub and emergent wetland.

Please add this request to the November 13, 2014 meeting agenda of the LSOHC, and please provide the appropriate 15 business day advance notification to the legislature as I understand is required by law. Thank you very much for your assistance with this important request, and please let me know if you have any questions or concerns, or require additional information. Sincerely, Jon.

Dear Mr. Schneider:

Thank you for you offer to donate the 28-acre Marlow Tract on Moose Lake in Government Lot 3, Section 26, Township 60 North, Range 19 West, in St. Louis County, Minnesota to the USDA Forest Service for inclusion in the Superior National Forest for long-term ownership and management. We understand this land was acquired through a 2011 Minnesota state appropriation from the Outdoor Heritage Fund (Minnesota Laws of 2011, First Special Session, Chapter 6, Article 1, Section 2, Subdivision 4 (c) "Shallow Lake Shoreland Protection: Wild Rice Lakes") and there are certain ongoing responsibilities the landowner is asked to perform.

The Superior National Forest appreciates this potential land donation. If acquired, we would manage and maintain the land for wildlife habitat conservation purposes, and keep it open to the public for outdoor recreation including hunting and fishing, which is consistent with the Superior National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan dated July 2004 (Forest Plan.)

Specifically, we understand that Minn. Stat. 97A.056 Subdivision 15 requires property acquired with money appropriated from the Outdoor Heritage Fund to be used in perpetuity for the conservation purpose for which the appropriation was made. In this case, the conservation purpose is wild rice shoreland protection and public outdoor recreation. Wild rice conservation is consistent with Executive Order 11990 Protection of Wetlands (May 24, 1977, 42 F.R. 26961) as well as direction that would apply to the property once it becomes part of the National Forest System. Specifically, the property would be managed pursuant to the General Forest Management Area direction described in the Forest Plan. If you wish to review the Desired Condition, Standards and Guidelines, and Allowable Management Practices for the General Forest Management Area, I would be happy to share a copy of the Forest Plan with you. It is also available on our website at

http://www.fs.usda.gov/main/superior/landmanagement/planning.

We also confirm that public outdoor recreation is one of the Forest Service functions pursuant to 36 CFR §200.3 and is also encouraged in the General Forest Management Area.

We understand that pursuant to Minn. Stat. 97A.056 Subdivision 15, ownership of the interest in real property transfers to the state if: (1) the holder of the interest in real property fails to comply



with the terms and conditions of the grant agreement or accomplishment plan; or (2) restrictions are placed on the land that preclude its use for the intended purpose as specified in the appropriation.

Once the land is part of the National Forest System, we agree to provide the state with an annual statement on the status of the property to the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council or its successor in a form determined by the council as required by 97A.056 Subdivision 16. This statement will include a verification of the status of the hunting and fishing management plan for the land, and that it remains open for public use.

We look forward to working with you to acquire this sensitive piece of wild rice shoreland once you receive approval from the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council and, thereafter, upon approval of title by the USDA, Office of the General Counsel. Please note that certain grant requirements may not be acceptable under Department of Justice Title Standards. To the extent any grant requirements can be waived, based on the acquisition of the land by the Forest Service and its management as described above, it would expedite the review of title by OGC.





Excerpt from August 2012 adopted Council Procedures, page 4 & 5

8. Land Acquisition Restrictions – Council Process

1. Duties of Land Holders

Holders of an interest in real property must submit a written application to alter land at least 60 days prior to a proposed change occurring. The application will describe the land being altered, the parties involved and any replacement plans.

2. Council Process

- a. Minor conversions or conveyances. The executive director of the L-SOHC is granted the discretion to approve applications for minor conversions or conveyances and report minor approvals to the council and the proposed replacement plans. The chairs and ranking minority members of the committees with jurisdiction over the Outdoor Heritage Fund must be notified 15 business days before issuing such approval.
- b. Condemnations. The executive director will notify council members and the chairs and ranking minority members of the committees with jurisdiction over the Outdoor Heritage Fund upon learning of condemnation of Outdoor Heritage Fund property. In the case of condemnation, the condemnation process will proceed without council consideration. Following the completion of the condemnation proceedings, the condemned party will notify the council of the settlement terms and replacement plans. The council may a) accept the replacement plans; or b) instruct the condemned party to deposit the state's share of the proceeds of condemnation in the Outdoor Heritage Fund.
- c. All Other Conversions or Alterations. In the case of major conversions or conveyances, the executive director will forward the application to the council for review and approval and notify the chairs and ranking minority members of the committees with jurisdiction over the Outdoor Heritage Fund that the council will consider of the alteration and any replacement plans at the next meeting of the council 15 business days from the date of notification.
- 3. Replacement Plans and Recordation. The council must consider and approve the alteration or conveyance and any replacement as a whole. The replacement plan must include an appraisal of the land to be altered or conveyed and if appropriate, an appraisal of the land to be replaced for the altered or conveyed land. The replacement plan must meet the following criteria: (1) the interest is at least equal in fair market value, as certified by the commissioner of natural resources, to the interest being replaced; and (2) the interest is in a reasonably equivalent location and has a reasonably equivalent useful conservation purpose compared to the interest being replaced, taking into consideration all effects from fragmentation of the whole habitat. The applicant must complete the replacement plan and makes notice of funding restriction to the appropriate local government office or repay the Outdoor Heritage Fund within one calendar year of decision.
- 4. **Non-Approval.** If the action is not approved, LSOHC will provide applicant an explanation for decision, including, incomplete information, inappropriate exchange, lack of timely notification, and/or improper land use alteration.

Abstract:

This program will protect approximately 1,240 acres of wild rice lake shoreland habitat through permanent conservation easements and fee-title acquisition, the Council's top Priority Action identified for the Northern Forest Section.

Program Narrative

Design and Scope of Work

This program will initiate a new statewide programmatic initiative to address the growing problem of shoreline development by providing private shallow lake shoreline landowners with expanded protection options through existing permanent shoreland conservation easement programs and, where needed and on a more limited basis, fee-title acquisition. Emphasis will be placed on securing permanent conservation easements over fee-title acquisition, which will protect shoreland while keeping land in private ownership and on local and county tax rolls. During this initial phase of the program, we will focus on shallow wild rice lakes in the Northern Forest Section by acquiring permanent easements or fee-title on 700 acres along key shallow wild rice lakes to insure the long-term sustainability of our unique wild rice habitat resource. Future proposals will expand the scope of our work to protect other shallow lakes in other Sections too, especially the Transition, Prairie, and Metro.

To accomplish that outcome, Ducks Unlimited and the Minnesota Board of Water & Soil Resources (BWSR) will offer permanent shoreland conservation easements on shallow lakes through both the BWSR's Reinvest In Minnesota (RIM) program (830 acres) and Ducks Unlimited's conservation easement program (50 acres). Additionally, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MNDNR) will also secure fee-title acquisitions on a more limited basis (360 acres) when key shallow lake shoreland tracts are for sale, when landowners prefer to sell the fee-title over an easement offer, and for in-holdings in public land or key parcels adjacent to public land. In cases where key parcels are adjacent to non-state public land, MNDNR may grant money from this appropriation to local units of government to acquire, hold, and manage such parcels. Local units of government must comply with all provisions set forth in this appropriation. Eligible costs covered by the grant will include professional services. In this initial three-year pilot program, we propose to protect approximately 1,240 shoreland acres of upland forest and wetland habitat adjacent to wild rice lakes in an eight county area of north-central Minnesota.

Because this is a new program and Ducks Unlimited does not currently have a field biologist in the Northern Forest Section promoting DU easements, and because the BWSR does not currently have funding for a RIM shoreland easement program, a list of specific easement tract parcels is not currently available. Nonetheless, the MNDNR and SWCDs have estimated that at least 700 unprotected acres on 117 priority shallow wild rice lakes in eight north-central counties are in immediate need of protection to prevent development, and have also developed a list of those where fee-title acquisition may be more appropriate. Lists of proposed BWSR RIM easement tracts will be submitted to the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council later once developed for Council approval prior to easement purchase.

Ducks Unlimited will work closely with the BWSR, MNDNR, county soil and water conservation districts (SWCDs), federal agencies, tribal interests, and other local units of government to identify specific privately held shoreline tracts on 117 important shallow wild rice lakes in the heart of Minnesota's wild rice range. These 117 important wild rice lakes have recently been identified by local, county, state, federal, tribal, and private partners participating in the MNDNR's "Wild Rice Working Group" as being some of the most "important shallow wild rice lakes" that support approximately 50,000 acres of wild rice habitat in the eight counties of north-central Minnesota. Other wild rice and shallow prairie shallow lakes the Transition, Prairie, and Metro Sections are also in dire need of shoreland protection, and those lakes will be addressed in future phases of this program via new proposals in the future.

Ducks Unlimited and the BWSR will work closely to coordinate the development and promotion of new easement options to private landowners, and to negotiate the purchase of permanent conservation easements or fee-title acquisition by DNR or Cass Co from willing sellers to protect approximately 1,240 acres from future subdivision, development, and shoreline alteration. Tracts to be targeted for conservation easements will be selected based on the degree they help permanently protect all the land around a given wild rice lake (e.g., tracts on lakes with a large proportion of shoreline in permanent protection will be prioritized over tracts on lakes with extensive development and/or many unprotected tracts), threat of development, and other conservation variables yet to be identified by the "Wild Rice Working Group" and DU/BWSR.

Through SWCD offices in the eight counties and with the help of Ducks Unlimited and other partners, the BWSR will offer to purchase RIM shoreland easements from wild rice lake shoreline landowners using RIM rates set by the BWSR to protect approximately 500 acres. Ducks Unlimited will also work with shoreline owners to secure permanent conservation

easements on approximately 50 acres in cases where a RIM easement is not a satisfactory option for a landowner (e.g., in cases where a landowner prefers to sell an easement based on an appraisal to a non-governmental organization land trust that will hold, monitor, and enforce the easement). Ducks Unlimited will seek an overall land owner donation equal to 20% of the value of the acquired land and rights to land. Finally, in cases where land is for sale and conservation easements are not an option to protect shoreland or where a tract is a public land in-holding or is adjacent to extensive public land and is a desirable addition to public land holdings, the MNDNR, <u>DU</u>, and Cass County will secure approximately 360 acres via fee-title acquisition from willing sellers for future state ownership, or will grant funds to local units of government to secure and hold tracts that are adjacent to existing local government land. Because this is a land protection program and because most land on shallow wild rice lakes remains intact, little if any land restoration and management is needed and therefore those activities will not be an important component of easements secured through this program.

Lists of proposed BWSR RIM easement tracts will be submitted to the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council for approval prior to acquisition. RIM and Ducks Unlimited easements funded through this program will be purchased on land along the 117 wild rice lakes listed in the parcel list. Conservation easements acquired by Ducks Unlimited will be permanently held by Ducks Unlimited's Wetlands America Trust (WAT) and annually monitored by Ducks Unlimited professional land staff with stewardship endowment provided through this grant. RIM easements will be permanently secured and periodically monitored and enforced by the BWSR and county SWCD professional field staff through funding from the legislature for RIM easement monitoring. RIM easements will feature either a conservation plan or a forest stewardship plan that will be monitored annually in person during the first five years and periodically in person or by aerial photo reconnaissance thereafter. More limited acres of land acquired in fee-title will be owned and managed by MNDNR or another state or county agency for permanent ownership and management.

Shoreland protection for wild rice lakes enjoys widespread support from tribal interests, SWCDs, Minnesota Forestry Association, sportsmen clubs, and other wild rice stakeholders in north-central Minnesota. Independent letters of support for this work have been submitted separately to the Council.

In June 2012, DU amended this accomplishment plan to add Lower Hand Lake to the acquisition parcel list (previously listed for easements), and to add these words: "budget reallocations up to 10% do not require an amendment to the Accomplishment Plan." In March 2013, DU requested an amendment on behalf of BWSR and DNR to change BWSR's project officer to Tim Koehler, to reallocate funds among budget categories within BWSR and DNR budgets, and to adjust outcome estimates in Tables 1-7. In June 2013, DU requested an amendment on behalf of BWSR to reallocate budgeted expenses from Professional Services (reduced by \$18,500) to Easement Acquisition (increased by \$8,500) and Personnel (increased by \$10,000). This amendment affects the BWSR budget portion of the overall grant budget only, and is required due an increase in the number of individual RIM easements secured and processed thru this grant by BWSR.

In March 2014, DU requested an amendment to reallocate \$64,880 from Personnel, \$10,000 from Travel (total of \$74,880), and \$128,000 from Easement Acquisition to Fee Acquisition w/o PILT within DU's portion of the grant budget to allow DU to purchase 28 acres in fee-title on Moose Lake for transfer to the U.S. Forest Service. This 28-acre parcel is the last private parcel on Moose Lake and is subdivided and for sale for development, thus acquisition is paramount to protect this wild rice lake. All other shoreland on Moose Lake is U.S. National Forest land.

Planning

This program will permanently protect approximately 1,240 acres of upland forest and wetland habitat on wild rice lakes through permanent conservation easements and fee-title acquisition, which is the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council's top Priority Action identified for the Northern Forest Section of Minnesota ("Protect shoreland and restore or enhance critical habitat on wild rice lakes, shallow lakes,..."). Further, shoreland protection via both fee-title purchase and permanent conservation easements comprise the top two Habitat Recommendations listed in the "Minnesota Conservation and Preservation Plan" (Priority 1 = "Protect Priority Land Habitats" and Priority 2 = "Protect Critical Shorelands of Streams and Lakes"). Finally, according to the DNR's Wild Rice Report to the legislature, more than 17 wildlife species in the state "Comprehensive Wildlife Conservation Strategy – Tomorrow's Habitat for the Wild & Rare" are listed as "species of greatest conservation need" use wild rice lake habitat for breeding or foraging.

Initial program efforts will target 117 shallow lakes identified by the MNDNR's "Wild Rice Working Group" and specific tracts selected for conservation easements will be identified based on the degree to which they help add to the base of land in permanent protection around a given wild rice lake (tracts on lakes with much shoreline in permanent protection will be prioritized over tracts on lakes with extensive development and/or many unprotected tracts that will take more time to completely protect), threat of development, and other variables to be identified by the "Wild Rice Working Group". A list of tracts selected for BWSR RIM easements will be presented to the Council for approval prior to purchase. Ducks Unlimited conservation easements funded by this grant will only purchased on these lakes.

Through this initial programmatic effort, Ducks Unlimited and Wild Rice Lakes Working Group partners will also develop a list of privately owned tracts on these 117 important shallow wild rice lakes and start to determine landowner interest in future easements or fee-title acquisition to guide future funding requests to further protect wild rice lakes in the Northern Forest Section. The long-term program goal is to continue working with private wild rice landowners in the future to protect privately owned, undeveloped tracts on these key wild rice lakes while also expanding these shoreland protection programs to other shallow lakes around the state in the Transition, Prairie, and Metro Sections.

Relationship to Other Constitutional Funds

This program funding compliments state bonding and Environment & Natural Resources Trust Fund support for RIM easements that are combined with Wetlands Reserve Program (WRP) easements in the Prairie, Prairie-Forest, and Metro Sections by funding a shoreland RIM easement program for the Northern Forest Section. It also expands and accelerates Trust Fund support for Ducks Unlimited and Minnesota Land Trust conservation easements that do not generally target wild rice lake shoreland. Importantly, this program fills a niche that targets funding for shoreland protection specifically on shallow lakes, unlike most other programs.

Relationship to Current Organizational Budget

This grant funding does not substitute for any traditional funding sources to Ducks Unlimited or the BWSR for shallow lake shoreland protection. Ducks Unlimited has no traditional funding source for purchase of land or conservation easements, and relies on state and federal grants to fund this work. The BWSR does not currently offer or have traditional funding for RIM shoreland easements, and currently prioritizes RIM funding to leverage WRP funding for RIM-WRP restoration easements that generally do not apply to the protection of wild rice lake shoreland in the Northern Forest Section.

Sustainability and Maintenance

Conservation easements acquired by Ducks Unlimited will be permanently held by Ducks Unlimited's Wetlands America Trust (WAT) and annually monitored by Ducks Unlimited professional land protection staff through stewardship endowment provided by this grant. Ducks Unlimited calculates the funding required to endow long-term stewardship for each easement it holds based on the location, size, complexity, and other factors related to staff costs to annually monitor and enforce easement terms. RIM easements will be secured and permanently monitored and enforced by the BWSR and county SWCDs professional field staff, and will become the responsibility of the state. Land acquired in fee-title will be owned and managed by MNDNR or other state, local, or federal conservation agency. The tracts to be protected through this grant are generally forested, and protection clauses will be focused largely on maintaining existing forest stands and preventing shoreline alterations (especially subdivision and development), and therefore will be relatively straightforward to monitor and manage.
