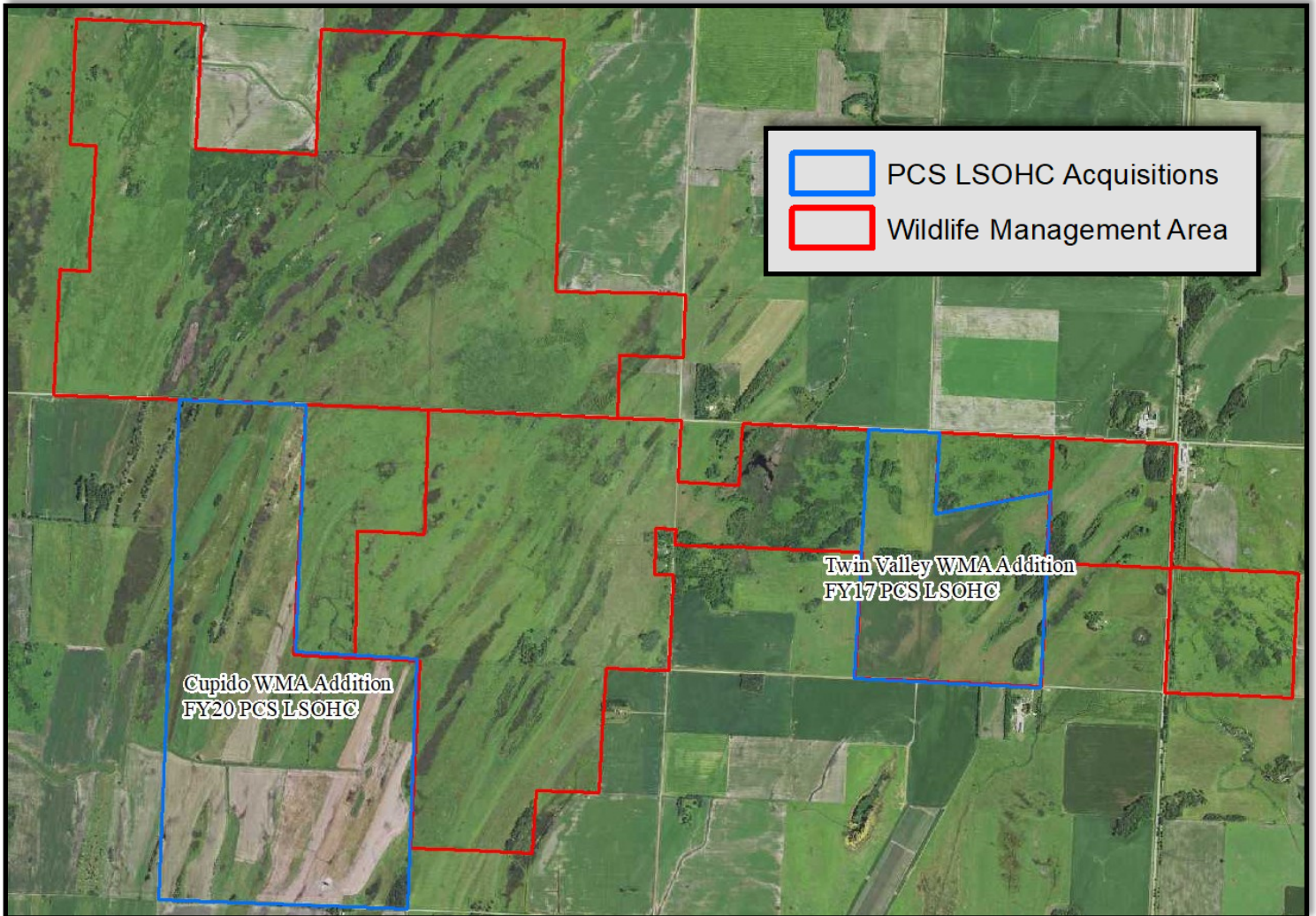

# Cupido and Twin Valley State Wildlife Management Areas



The addition of the Cupido WMA acquisition in Norman County adds 955 acres of permanently protected land to an existing prairie habitat complex. In addition to Cupido WMA this program also added the 398 acre Twin Valley WMA addition in 2018. These properties add significant habitat for prairie chickens and other wildlife and demonstrate the focus and success that this partnership is able to obtain.
