




Phase 3

Land Protection

Using two different easement programs, the Minnesota Land Trust (MLT), U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and The Nature Conservancy (TNC) are working jointly to protect a 295-acre property along 1.5 miles of Pipestone Creek in Pipestone County. TNC and USFWS will protect 96 acres of this property as a working grassland; the remaining 199 acres will be protected by MLT. This property provides habitat for Species in Greatest Conservation Need; the stream is designated as Critical Habitat for the federally endangered Topeka shiner.







Restoration

The Gazda property in Jackson county is just one example of the work in southwest Minnesota where Minnesota Land Trust and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) are partnering to accomplish restoration and enhancement of wetland and upland habitat. This project included the restoration of native prairie, as part of a wetland complex restored by additional partners. This work restores the historic hydrology of the area and adds diversity back to the landscape. These before and after photos show the difference just one project can make.
